

CHAPTER 1

SECTION X. ACADEMIC RENEWAL

Undergraduate students who, after dropping out or being suspended because of academic reasons, who, after

re-enrolling at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, may be eligible for academic renewal. Academic renewal is a process that allows students to have previous academic work removed from their cumulative GPA and to start with a clean slate. This process is designed to help students who have experienced academic difficulties to get back on track and complete their degree program. The process is governed by the University's Academic Renewal Policy, which is outlined in the University Catalog. Students who are eligible for academic renewal must meet the following criteria:

- 1. Be a full-time undergraduate student at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.
- 2. Have completed at least 12 semester hours of college-level work.
- 3. Have a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher in all college-level work completed.
- 4. Have completed all required coursework for their degree program.
- 5. Have a minimum of two semesters of college-level work remaining to complete their degree program.

Students who meet these criteria may apply for academic renewal through the Office of the Registrar. The application process involves submitting a request form, a letter of explanation, and a transcript of all college-level work completed. The Registrar's Office will review the application and determine if the student is eligible for academic renewal. If approved, the student's previous academic work will be removed from their cumulative GPA, and they will be able to start with a clean slate. Academic renewal is a second chance for students who have experienced academic difficulties, and it can help them get back on track and complete their degree program.
